## Car Hit In Crossing Accident

Railroad Sanctioned For Spoliation

## \$12 Million Verdict

The parents of a 20-year-old Cass County man sued Kansas City Southern Railway after he was killed in a railroad crossing accident.

On Sept. 12, 1998, Jared Sturdevant and his girlfriend, Ashkea Wood, were driving near Cleveland, Mo., when they attempted to cross the railroad tracks on Lone Pine Drive. Sturdevant was behind the wheel of the car belonging to Wood's mother when the couple was struck by a KC Southern train traveling about 15 mph. Wood was critically injured and died after 38 days in intensive care. Sturdevant was pronounced dead at the scene.

Sturdevant's parents, Lynda and Gary Sturdevant, claimed that the train engineer failed to blow his whistle in a timely manner. They also argued that the railroad failed to properly adjust and maintain the flashing warning lights at the crossing, which did not have a safety gate, and that brush had overgrown the area, preventing Sturdevant from seeing the train until he was on the tracks.

The railroad denied all claims, argu-

ing that Sturdevant failed to yield to the train, and that it was not negligent.

In April 2003, Wood's parents went to trial against the railroad. In that case, the court granted the parents' motion for sanctions against KC Southern for destroying evidence including the locomotive's "black box" — an audio tape and event recorder. The Woods' case resulted in a \$4.8 million verdict.

In the Sturdevant case, the plaintiffs argued that KC Southern destroyed or failed to produce 10 other categories of evidence in addition to the missing black box. After a 10-day trial the jury assessed the plaintiffs' damages at \$20 million, but allocated 40 percent of the fault to Sturdevant, reducing the verdict to \$12 million.
